Entries were judged by Dereham's Working Together Group and done anonymously with no one allowed to vote for their own.






Everyone at **Great Yarmouth Community Hub** has had a great time in the run up to Christmas.

They've enjoyed a lunch, carol singers, and a party with the Hub's Father Christmas (AJ the caretaker).


























Riding badge success
