




Well done to Massimo who organised these festive events and made a poster for everyone to choose which ones they would like to attend.






HSM Christmas Competition



Neurodiversity and Disabilities – blocks and barriers to employment

As a disability employer, Norfolk Industries is acutely aware of the very real struggles disadvantaged people can face when looking for paid employment.

The <u>EVOLVE programme</u> provides placements to those who are struggling in their search for work due to visible/invisible disabilities, learning disabilities, learning difficulties, Autism and Aspergers, as well as other barriers including long-term unemployment or a lack of work/life skills.

It was recently reported that the number of people inactive in the UK due to long-term sickness or disability has risen by nearly half a million since the pandemic. But what can be done to improve the situation?

EVOLVE Assessment Support Officer, Leanne Conner carried out some research through social media to find out more about the specific issues people faced when looking for work or attending interviews.

The feedback brought up a number of common themes and Leanne has created some guidance which she hopes will give employers a better understanding of the needs of people who are neuro-diverse, or have learning difficulties or disabilities, and encourage them to do more to support their needs.

Leanne's Research Findings

Things that would help and support people who are neuro-diverse, have learning difficulties or disabilities.

- Have a printout of key information, numbers and names
- Offer a choice of face to face or online interviews
- Provide questions in advance or an idea of what might come up
- Limit verbal information and have more things written down
- Replace the interview with a written or practical exam that allows the candidate to demonstrate they can do the job
- Hold shorter interviews
- Offer part time, hybrid, or working from home options to suit the individual
- Make candidates feel safe and comfortable to share their diagnosis or disability information

Note that the responses are all personal to each individual. Not every person experiences things in the same and a person-centred approach is usually best to establish what works best for each individual.





Wildlife blog

Hello everyone, the TAPS wildlife team here! What a great time we've had this year, getting out and about visiting Norfolk's wildlife/bird reserves.

We saw whooper swans, spoonbills and nesting swallows at Welney Wetlands and took a guided tour of the site and a picnic lunch. At Norfolk Wildlife Trust Cley & Salthouse marshes we watched a variety of wetland/wader birds from the hides, as well as marsh harriers searching for food. The sun shone all day, so we enjoyed a picnic lunch on the visitor centre's veranda overlooking the marshes, everyone said what a relaxing, beautiful place it is.

Next was Pensthorpe where we got to see lots of different species of duck and visit the wader enclosure, where we saw a lot of birds up close, including avocets and ruff black winged stilt.



Jasmine bought some food to feed the ducks and geese so was very popular, we also saw flamingos and cranes.

We also visited Foxley Wood and Holkham where everyone was amazed to see the large amount of fallow deer and also some young fawns from this spring.



With winter now upon us, some small mammals including hedgehogs will now be hibernating. These little prickly friends are sadly in decline and we need to do all we can to help them, which is what we did in the summer when a small hedgehog was found in our poly tunnel. It was a bit warm and dehydrated but, after a call to the great people at PACT for advice, we put it in one of our hedgehog boxes with some food and water. After about half an hour the box was empty and it had gone on its merry way, hopefully into the dried wood pile close by. Always remember if you see a small hedgehog out during the day it may need your help.

Winter means migration for a lot of birds, especially geese, you may have seen and heard some overhead. Other birds visit us for the winter, mostly from Scandinavia, including redwings, fieldfares, and the waxwing, there seems to have been plenty of sightings of these in Norfolk this year. It's also time for the 'Snettisham Spectacular' when the tide pushes the wader birds closer to the mudflats and thousands of birds all take to the skies causing a huge display of wings and noise. If you've not experienced it, you can catch videos on YouTube.

Winter may be cold, but it's also a great time to get out and watch birds and wildlife. Sometimes winter can lower our moods with dark nights and mornings, so there's nothing better for wellbeing than a great walk. We have another trip to Cley planned where we'll be wrapping up warm and hoping to see a lot more of our beautiful migrant and resident birds.
