



## Summer update from our wildlife bloggers

Hello everyone, the TAPS wildlife team here with more updates and wildlife news.

It's been a good year for fledglings at the hub. We watched babies from our two blue tit nests start to fly and one even paid us a visit in our TAPS room. He had a fly around and was a bit lost, so we opened the high windows, and he found his way out and back to his mum.

We've also had great tit fledglings, as well as blackbirds, dunnocks and the most exciting bird of all, a baby oystercatcher (see photo top right). You may remember we have regular visits from the oystercatchers each year. They are a wader bird found in coastal and wetlands areas, but during the past 50 years they've started to breed inland. They eat mussels and cockles on the coast but like many birds enjoy worms inland. They lay between one and four eggs and are ground nesting, so this very cute little baby must have been born at the hub. We're guessing he's around 3 weeks old but not big enough yet to fly. They fledge at around 33 days so hopefully we'll see more of him/her.

Some other exciting news is that we are now able to go out to visit places to birdwatch. We visited Sculthorpe Hawk and Owl Trust where we saw a lot of new species that the group hadn't encountered before, including little egrets, lapwings and reed buntings. We were lucky with the weather and had a great day finished off with a picnic where we were joined by a feathery friend.

We followed this with a visit to Titchwell marshes which was also a lovely day. The first bird to greet us was a large grey heron, looking around for his breakfast. We watched marsh harriers hunting the marshes and the group got to see the emblem of the RSPB - the avocet.

As well as the birds, Tim spotted the very beautiful Chinese water deer (top right). We watched in anticipation, willing her to come closer but she wasn't brave enough.

We also saw some dragonflies fluttering around. Both these trips have opened a new world of birds for the group, and we have already got more trips planned to Cley & Salthouse marshes, Welney wetlands and Pensthorpe. So, who knows who might join us there.

We all enjoy looking for wildlife and birds when we are out and about with family and friends. Claire got to see the spectacular swallowtail butterfly at Hickling Broad. Predominantly a Norfolk species, they are the largest UK butterfly and very beautiful. She's shared one of her photos below.

Volunteering as a reading coach has been such a rewarding experience.



I wanted to keep learning and reading, I asked Anne to find books for me to read with her and continue to see her once a week to read together. I use my new reading skills every day, I love to chair the Working Together group meetings. Reading the agenda makes we feel very proud of what I have achieved.

My computer skills are getting much better now I can read what I am doing. I got myself a smart phone, I WhatsApp family and friends all the time and find it easy to read what they are telling me. I have so much freedom to keep in touch with everyone on my own.

With my newfound confidence I have joined an adult learning maths support course which aims to help people find work and manage money better.

I would highly recommend anyone have a go, I learnt so much and feel so good about myself, I have made friends and love my newfound independence.

# Rachel finds her purr-fect home!


Just a few months ago, Rachel was living in a first floor flat with her elderly cat, Smudge.




